We have worked with various churches in the area of Revitalization, and led pastor search committees or team trainings, while also providing informative statistics about their surrounding populations through Demographic Research reports. We have also provided small group leader training, A Freedom in Christ study, D life discipleship training, Pastor Cohort groups, and Pastor Round Table meetings. We have obtained informational and motivational speakers to equip and share other ministry ideas at our monthly Pastor's Gatherings. We have participated in several ministry initiatives, such as the Baptist Children's Home Food Round Up, Coats for the City, building wheelchair ramps, and a VBS clinic. We have also hosted an Appreciation Dinner for our Ministry Assistants, a Minister & Wives Christmas Banquet, many Sr. Adult lunch and learn programs, as well as a yearly Sr. Adult Banquet for all association seniors. We recently had a dinner for our Minister's Wives, and are excited about beginning our new Minister's Wives Ministry to engage and support these women throughout the year.

It is exciting that we as an association of churches, along with the Baptist State Convention, and the North American Mission Board have assisted Glen Hope Baptist Church in establishing a Hispanic church plant.

We are also working with two churches with the State Convention to merge with two other churches to have churches that are healthy and vibrant.
